



## **NSPA OECD follow-up Forum**

## Tuesday 14th March 2017 Swedish Representation to the EU, Square de Meeûs 30, Brussels, Belgium

The aim for the forum is to deepen the common understanding of the OECD Territorial Review on the NSPA and the common work ahead in the NSPA, so as to make use of the study and its recommendations. To this end, the forum will for this also put the NSPA in an overall EU context and the constraints which the EU will have to tackle in the future, in order be able to deliver a basis for the discussion on how to assure continued EU and national support for investments in the NSPA regions in line with the OECD findings. The currently ongoing discussions on the future of the EU cohesion policy and the link to the new EU integrated Arctic policy will be highlighted. Along with discussions with each speaker, there will also be a workshop for the NSPA representatives to discuss the next steps and how to build the continued work within the NSPA network.
