Common features of the Barents Region

- peripheral localisation
- sparse population and large area
- many ethnic minorities

 delayed start of industrialisation followed by a rapid industrialisation process

• immigration of large groups of the nation's majority people in the area

 radicalisation of the work force and polarisation between radical and traditional groups • a kind of "polar romanticism" which a lot of modernising actors held regarding the northern dimension of each nation state

 post-modern efforts to strengthen the higher education

• revitalisation process which many of the national minorities went through during the last part of the 20th century
